BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WILLINGBORO, IN THE COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section One. 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#### A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WILLINGBORO AUTHORIZING AN EMERGENCY CONTRACT PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6 FOR EMERGENCY STORM SEWER REHABILITATION AT 47 & 49 BALFOUR LANE, WILLINGBORO

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works and Township Engineers have identified a significant sinkhole behind the sidewalk between 47 and 49 Balfour Lane, directly about existing storm sewer pipe; and

WHEREAS, upon investigation, the Department of Public Works temporarily filled the sinkhole for safety reasons; and

WHEREAS, the Township Engineer recommends that the storm sewer pipe joints be rehabilitated using trenchless technology to prevent further migration of soil; and

WHEREAS, it is the Township Engineer's opinion that in the current condition, storm sewer pipe joint separation presents a danger and/or hazard to the public warranting emergency repairs; and

WHEREAS, this presents a health and safety issue for the Township's residents; and

WHEREAS, the recommendation and Emergency Procurement report to the Division of Local Government Services is attached hereto indicating the reasons the emergency exists; and

WHEREAS, such an emergency qualifies as an exception under the Local Public Contracts law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6, which authorizes the award of a contract without public bidding; and

WHEREAS, the Township received an emergency cost proposal from the Diversified Infrastructure Services, Inc., to repair the existing storm sewer pipes using trenchless technology, in the amount of \$38,575.00; and

WHEREAS, the Township has found that the cost proposal submitted by Diversified Infrastructure Services, Inc., in the amount of \$38,575.00 submitted is reasonable and responsible; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council has upon its consideration and review determined that it is in the best interest of the Township to authorize the contract with Diversified Infrastructure Services, Inc., at 1604 Thomaston, Unit J, Waterbury CT 06704, in the total amount of \$38,575.00.

WHEREAS, the Township Council finds that this is an emergency contract under the Local Public Contracts law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-6, which may be awarded without publicly advertising for bids and bidding;

WHEREAS, funds are available for this purpose as indicated by the attached Treasurer's Certification.
