June 1, 2021 COUNCIL COMMENTS/OUESTIONS TO MUNICIPAL UPDATE

Councilman Anderson:

- What happens when landfills are full, and they close what options are there?
 - o Mr. Howard: Whoever is collecting our trash at the time must come up with solution; They will role that in trash collection fees; Mr. Brevogel: Minimize amount of trash created. Transferred 9450 a ton now. Not going to be 9450 it will be extremely higher.
- Are there any strategies in place as far as a committee? What I do not want to happen for whatever reason is another backlash on council and community; see what the options are and do a better job at preparing for situation; Don't wait until the last minute and suddenly we are re in the same situation.
 - Mr. Howard: I agree with you sir. There are members of Council that are helping
 us push the zero-waste strategy, which is the kickoff to start reducing trash that
 goes to the land field, and the future cost when the Land field is closed.

Councilwoman Perrone:

- I have a few concerns with the trash collection on many levels. After reaching and double checking, we did not receive a contract for the trash pickup; . We received an ordinance, in reference to the contracts; Typically, the contract is attached to the ordinance; The council has never received the contract;
 - o Mr. Howard: When we send out bids, they are very specific. Contract is a combination of resolution bid specs and respond to bid specs.
- We are speaking about a bid and contract. There is no contract to date. This contract is null and void until we receive it and vote for it.
 - o Mr. Howard: There was a vote on the recommendation.

Mayor Worthy:

o I did not receive a contract; I participated in meeting & vote were council voted on the resolution.

Mr. Turner:

o I have a draft copy of the contract that still needs to be tighten up before sent to republic.

Deputy Mayor McIntosh:

O There is excess trash; to tell people to hold on to it, is not good; Looking for some alternatives; Fairmont and Rittenhouse isn't getting it; it doesn't fit for our whole town; Doesn't that null and void the contract? minimal communication in a big change; What are our options to help relieve some of the pressure of this abrupt change?

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- o Mr. Howard: We didn't do the best job at communicating. We do have to make a change; asked Mr. Brevogel to figure out how we can make this transition easier
- There was no transition. We can't get rid of the trash right now. What are the alternatives? What can we do to elevate the trash right now?
 - o Mr. Howard: We won't leave trash behind. We can't do it long term.
- Councilman Anderson:
 - We were under the impression that there was a contact in place. What happens to trash collection? We dropped the ball. Communication didn't go out, that is very disheartening. How long is the transition period?
- Councilwoman Perrone:
 - We can use competitive contracting. Would like to have a discussion on what we have.
- Mayor Worthy:
 - Re-look at bid specs to see what our options are? How we can be a clean community. Is there anything else we need related to this process?
- Councilwoman Whitfield:
 - o What does the grace period look like?
- Deputy Mayor McIntosh:
 - The no automation for Rittenhouse and Fairmount Park, how does that change the bid? What is tax impact of all bids?
- Councilwoman Whitfield:
 - What is the plan for reinstating the trash can throughout the community that were removed?
- Mayor Worthy:
 - How quickly will we be able to get some feedback on revisiting the bid specs and the items discussed tonight? What the options are?
 - Mr. Howard: will speak with Solicitor tomorrow. We will have discussion.
 Will work through it.
 - Mr. Brevogel stated that Republic didn't refuse to do trash in Rittenhouse/Fairmount. We stated that we would meet with them and get back to Republic.
- Councilwoman Whitfield:
 - All trash piled up is a problem. Delay in recycling pickup is a problem.
 We need to do our research and have a strategy.
- Deputy Mayor:
 - Right now, what can residents do with their extra trash?
 - Mr. Brevogel: I don't have an answer for that.
 - Mr. Howard: Public works and the contractor both indicated that they won't leave trash in the street. We will work to collect the garbage. However, that can't be the long term answer.
- Councilwoman Whitfield:

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- o Residents should put out all their trash and it will be collected?
 - Mr. Howard: The trash that is put out we have obligated ourselves to pick up. Those homes not in compliance will get notification that they are not in compliance.
- Mayor Worthy:
 - o Look forward in receiving that transition plan. All that we mention. In the interim resident trash will be picked up. Is that correct Mr. Howard?
 - Mr. Howard: Yes
