

PROCLAMATION OF WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH IN HONOR OF ALPHA KAPPA ALPHA SORORITY, INCORPORATED

WHEREAS, each year, Women's History Month offers an important opportunity for us to shine a light on the extraordinary legacy of trailblazing women and girls who have built, shaped, and improved upon our Communities.

WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. was founded on the campus of Howard University on January 15, 1908 and incorporated as a national organization on January 29, 1913. It is the oldest Greek Letter Organization established by African American college-trained women. The Sorority has flourished into a globally impactful organization of nearly 300,000 college-trained members, bound by the bonds of sisterhood and empowered by a commitment to servant-leadership on both the local and global scale; and

WHEREAS, throughout history, women have made vital contributions, often in the faces of discrimination and undue hardship on June 29, 1986, professional women of Alpha Kappa Alpha, Inc. chartered Pi Mu Omega Chapter in Willingboro, New Jersey. As a sisterhood, Pi Mu Omega prides itself in fostering a bond that keeps the foundation of sisterliness strong and service at the forefront of every activity and program they do; and

WHEREAS, since the inception of the charter, Pi Mu Omega Chapter has remained committed to meeting needs of the community through a variety of successful service, education, scholarship, leadership, health, mentorship, and cultural and environmental awareness programs; and

WHEREAS, Pi Mu Omega Chapter members are women who represent Educators, Doctors, Business Executives, and Entrepreneurs, who reside throughout the counties of New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Delaware. The women of Pi Mu Omega Chapter display a tremendous presence in the community through services and involvement covering Burlington County and Willingboro particularly through their signature programs in partnership with PMO (People Motivating Others, Inc.), Men are Cookin (South Jersey), Annual Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Breakfast, National African American Read-In Chain with the Willingboro Public Library, and Sister Will You Help Me, a cancer support group for women of color sponsored through Cooper Hospital, and Willingboro Chapter.
