# RESOLUTION FOR FAIR DISTRIBUTION OF STATE AID FOR EDUCATION

WHEREAS, the Township of Willingboro, County of Burlington believes that every child should have equal resources of state aid distributed by the legislature for an education in the State of New Jersey by utilizing a fair school funding mechanism; and

WHEREAS, the current distribution of state aid for education to the schools has not been distributed in a fair and equitable manner to provide property tax relief to all the citizens of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, Article III., Paragraph 1, of the New Jersey State Constitution states, "The powers of government shall be divided among three distinct branches, the legislative, executive, and judicial. No person or persons belonging to or constituting one branch shall exercise any of the powers properly belonging to either of the others, except as expressly provided in this Constitution;" and

WHEREAS, Article VIII, Section IV, Paragraph 1, of the New Jersey State Constitution states, "the Legislature shall provide for the maintenance and support of a thorough and efficient system of free public schools for the instruction of all children in the State between the ages of five and eighteen year;" and

**WHEREAS**, Article VIII, Section IV, Paragraph 2, of the New Jersey State Constitution states, "the fund for the support of free public schools . . . shall be annually appropriated to the support of free public schools, and for the equal benefit of all the people of this State;" and

**WHEREAS**, Article VIII, Section I, Paragraph 7.a. of the New Jersey State Constitution states, the income tax is to be "annually appropriated . . . exclusively for the purpose of reducing or offsetting property taxes;" and

WHEREAS, this body can no longer bear the burden of the continued diversion of its fair share of state school aid for the students between the ages of five and eighteen years of age who reside within this jurisdiction.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the Township Council of the Township of Willingboro County of Burlington do hereby call upon the Legislature of the State of New Jersey to fulfill its constitutionally assigned duty to distribute the state aid for education to the school districts in this state in a fair manner that is for the equal benefit of all the people of the state and not by means that are prejudiced by the actions of special interests that may have been presented before the Court or other venue.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Clerk of this entity is hereby directed to forward a copy of this resolution to Governor Chris Christie, Senate President Stephen Sweeney, Senate Minority Leader Thomas Kean Jr., Assembly Speaker Sheila Oliver and Assembly Minority Leader Alex DeCroce.

# 4. TIME PERIOD COVERED BY THIS AGREEMENT:

- 4.1 This Agreement shall take effect when the Agency's Chief Executive Officer, or authorized representative, and the Executive Director of the Commission, acting on its behalf, signs the Agreement. This Agreement shall be effective upon signing by the second party, the "Effective Date."
- 4.2 The terms and covenants of this Agreement shall terminate in the following circumstances:
  - (a) By December 31, 2012 unless a successful on-site assessment is completed within that period of time; or
  - (b) Upon written notice by the Agency that it withdraws from the recognition process; or
  - (c) Upon termination pursuant to Section 5.2 or 6.1 hereof; or
  - (d) Upon expiration or revocation of the Agency's recognized status; or
  - (e) Notwithstanding any other provisions herein, at the option of either the Agency or the Commission, upon at least sixty (60) days prior notice by such party to the other specifying the date of termination.
- 4.3 The Commission may, at its discretion, upon request by the Agency, extend this Agreement in accordance with the terms and provisions of the CALEA Process and Programs Guide. (4.3 shall not apply to the Agency seeking Recognition through an Allied Program.)

# 5. MODIFICATION:

- 5.1 There shall be no modifications of this Agreement except in writing, signed by both parties, and executed with the same formalities as this document.
- 5.2 The Agency recognizes and acknowledges that it will be necessary for the Commission to make reasonable modifications and amendments to this Agreement, fees and other related documents, including but not limited to the recognition standards and procedures thereto and hereby agrees to endorse all modifications and amendments which the Agency deems reasonable. In the event the Agency deems such modifications or amendments unreasonable, the Commission reserves the right to terminate this Agreement after due consideration thereof by giving notice by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, that in the event the Agency refuses to accept and execute such modifications or amendments, then and in such event, this Agreement will be terminated.

#### 6. TIME AND MANNER OF PAYMENT:

- 6.1 The Agency will submit \$650 for initial recognition fee, which is not refundable. The Commission reserves the right to terminate this Agreement if payment is delinquent by more than sixty days.
- 6.2 If the Agency is determined ineligible to apply for participation in the recognition program, a full refund of all sums paid will be returned to the Agency.
- 6.3 The Commission reserves the right to terminate this Agreement if any payment required of Agency is delinquent by more than sixty (60) days.

#### 7. THE COMMISSION AS AN INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR:

- 7.1 In all matters pertaining to this Agreement, the Commission shall be acting as an independent contractor and neither the Commission nor any officer, employee, or agent of the Commission will be deemed an employee of the Agency. The selection and designation of the personnel of the Commission in performance of its responsibilities under this Agreement shall be made by the Commission.
- 7.2 In all matters pertaining to this Agreement and the relationship between the parties thereto, the Executive Director of the Commission will act in the name of the Commission.

#### 8. AUTHORITY:

8.1 The person signing on behalf of the Agency hereby represents and warrants that he or she has the power and authority to execute this Agreement and to bind said Agency to all terms and covenants contained herein including, but not limited to, the provisions of this Section 8.

#### 9. INTEGRATION:

9.1 This instrument embodies the whole Agreement of the parties. The parties warrant that there are no promises, terms, conditions, or obligations other than those contained herein. This Agreement shall supersede all previous communications, representations, or agreements, either verbal or written, between the parties hereto.

#### 10. SEVERABILITY:

10.1 If any provision of this Agreement or the application of such provision to any person or circumstance shall be held invalid, the remainder of this Agreement and the application of such provisions to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid shall not be affected thereby.

# 11. WARRANTY NOT INTENDED OR IMPLIED:

11.1It is understood that the Commission's award of recognition does not constitute a warranty, express or implied, of total or continued compliance by the Agency with all applicable standards of recognition and, further, that it is not a substitute for the Agency's ongoing and in-depth monitoring and evaluation of its activities and the quality of its services.

#### 12. WAIVER:

12.1 Any waiver by the Commission or any breach of this Agreement by the Agency shall relate only to that particular breach and shall not amount to a general waiver.

15.2 The Agency accepts the Commission's decisions as the final authority on all matters relating to the Commission's standards and accreditation and recognition programs.







Frank E. Rodgers retired as the Deputy Superintendent of the New Jersey State Police in 2007 at the rank of Lt. Colonel after twenty-five years of service. While serving in the second highest ranking position in the largest police department in the State of New Jersey, he led the Investigations Branch which consisted of in excess of 900 detectives, analysts and scientists assigned to 57 different units with an annual budget of in excess of seventy-five (75) million dollars. A strong advocate of police professionalism, strategic planning and accountability, he initiated and directed a complete restructuring of the organization's investigative assets predicated on the principles of "Intelligence Led Policing". During his tenure as the Deputy Superintendent of Investigations, he directed the development of the "Practical Guide to Intelligence Led Policing" which was published by the

Center for Policing and Terrorism at the Manhattan Institute and was adopted in February 2009 by the U.S Department of Justice as a model for conducting law enforcement operations.



The mission and vision of the Coalition is to promote the growth of CALEA accreditation in the New York metropolitan area and to provide vital assistance to agencies seeking international accreditation status with CALEA. Ted served as the

Coalition's first president and as its first and current executive director. Under his leadership and vision, the Coalition's membership has grown to 138 public safety agencies and has become a recognized leader in their field by CALEA. As the executive director, Ted has been responsible for leading over 100 law enforcement agencies, training academies, and communications centers through the CALEA accreditation process by providing for and developing a complex system of training, mentoring, networking, and evaluations.

In 2005, Ted personally forged a partnership between the New York / New Jersey law enforcement community and Aberdeen University where the Coalition holds a comprehensive accreditation and risk/liability mitigation conference each year. Since 2006, Ted has been a senior consultant to the New York City Police Department's training academy and the New Jersey State Police, considered by many to be one of the most diverse law enforcement agencies in the world, guiding their extremely successful accreditation programs. Ted has been a CALEA assessor since 2003 and has also served as an accreditation assessor and team leader with the New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police. In 2008, Ted began laying the foundation for the formation of the first ever International Public Safety Accreditation Coalition whose function is to provide for a virtual collaborative platform to enhance the abilities of other Coalitions and to promote the growth of CALEA accreditation across not only the United States but also around the world.

Ted is a certified Master CALEA Accreditation Manager who holds a bachelors degree in Administration of Justice from Thomas Edison State College and is a graduate of the Fairleigh Dickinson University's Certified Public Manager certificate program.





Dan Walsh retired from the New Jersey State Police at the rank of Lieutenant in 2008 after a distinguished career spanning 29 years. 
State policies, Division S.O.P.'s and Rules and Regulations.

After completing his assignment as a member of the agency's CALEA Core Group, Lt. Walsh served as the unit head of the Division's Civil Proceedings Unit. In November 2008, he received the "Attorney General's Award" for his distinguished performance in leading the New Jersey State Police's Accreditation Team which resulted in the New Jersey State Police becoming one of only eleven (11) CALEA Nationally Accredited Agencies in New Jersey.





**Sam Hishmeh** retired as the Deputy Chief of Police of the Long Hill Township Police Department, in December 2007, after having served 25 years in law enforcement.

The Long Hill Township Police Department was the first Nationally Accredited Law Enforcement Agency in New Jersey designated by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies in 1985. Deputy Chief Hishmeh was designated the department's Accreditation Manager in 1988 for the agency's re-accreditation efforts. During the next 19 years, Deputy Chief Hishmeh played an integral role with his agency's subsequent re-accreditation efforts and written directive system development. During his tenure with the Chatham Borough Police Department Chief Drake served in every key position within the Department. His







Chief Andrascik received his Bachelor's Degree from Fairleigh Dickinson University in 1984. He also has hundreds of hours of in service training relative to Police Supervision, Leadership and other areas of the Police profession.


