BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Council of the Township of Willingboro, assembled in public session this 4th day of January, 1997 as follows:

- 1. Core States Bank; First Union Bank NA South Jersey; United Jersey Bank; Farmers & Mechanics; Midlantic National Bank; National Westminster Bank; New Jersey State Cash Management Fund, are designated as depositories for any and all funds of the Township for the calendar year 1997. The custodian shall be the Township Treasurer. All disbursements shall be made by check signed by the Manager and the Treasurer or Mayor, after review and initial approval of the voucher by the Township Manager. The voucher will thereafter be presented to Township Council at its next meeting for ratification. The term "Manager" shall include the Acting Manager during that period of time when an Acting Manager is so designated by the Township Manager.
- 2. The Burlington County Times is designated as the primary advertising medium for all public notices pursuant to R.S. 35:1-2.1, and the Burlington County Times Philadelphia Inquirer, Trenton Times and Courier Post are designated as the newspapers to receive notice under the Open Public Meetings Act.
- 3. The first Tuesday of each month, at 7:30 p.m. prevailing time, at the Municipal Complex, One Salem Road, Willingboro, New Jersey, is designated as the formal meeting of Township Council for the recept of public comments, subject to further changes as may be determined by Council, and this shall be the meeting place for all other governmental bodies of the Township, except the Municipal Utilities Authority.
- 4. The rate of interest to be charged for the non-payment of taxes or added asdsessments in the event that any payment or any installment is not made within the tenth (10) calendar date after the date the same shall become payable, shall be either percent (8%) per annum on the first one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) of the delinquency, and eighteen percent (18%) on any amount in excess of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500), which shall be computed and charged to the principal sum due.

Taxpayers with a delinquency in excess of \$10,000 who fails to pay the delinquency prior to the end of the calendar year, shall be charged a penalty of 6% of the delinquency.

5. The custodian of such funds shall be Harry W. McFarland and the existing fund shall be closed out prior to December 31, 1997, in accordance with existing law.
- 7. A petty cash fund in the amount of one hundred dollars (\$100) is established pursuant to R.S. 40A5-21 for utilization by the Township Treasurer's Office. The custodian of such funds shall be Joanne G. Diggs, provided that such funds shall be closed out prior to December 31, 1997, in accordance with existing law.
- 8. A petty cash fund in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500) is established pursuant to R.S. 40A:5-21 for utilization by the Police Department, to pay for information provided to the Department. The custodian of such funds shall be Director of Public Safety, Benjamin C. Braxton, provided such funds shall be closed out prior to December 31, 1997, in accordance with existing law.
- 9. The Township Manager is hereby authorized and directed to approve refunds of Recreation Department program fees; tax refunds on residential properties due to tax appeals; refunds for duplicate payments, overpayments and cancellations of building and insection permits in the calendar year within which the permit was obtained, subject to ratification by Township Council.



 - 2. The benefits to be provided to Benjamin C. Braxton are:
 - a. Salary To be fixed in accordance with the Salary Ordinance and to provide for annual compensation of:
 - \$ 75,000.00 for 1997
 - \$ 77,500.00 for 1998
 - \$ 80,000.00 for 1999

- b. Medical and Dental Coverage for Husband and Wife to be chosen from among the plans offered to Township employees;
- c. Pension and Life Insurance as provided through the New Jersey Public Employees Retirement System (PERS);
- d. Paid Holidays The number of paid Holidays as provided for other Township management employee.
- e. Sick Leave The same number and accrual policy as applicable to other Township management employees [Fifteen (15) days for a full year], no limit on accrual with any payout on retirement to be limited to \$10,000.00]. Allowable sick leave to be pro-rated for any year in which the full year has not been completed as a Township employee.
- f. Vacation Leave The same number and accrual policy as applicable to other Township management employees, [1 day for each full month of employment during the first year of employent; beginning with the second year of employment 15 working days per year] subject to the Township's "use or lose" policy. [Any carry-over request must be approved by the Township Manager.]
- g. Membership Dues Paid membership for Professional Law Enforcement Organizations and Conference attendance for professional development as approved in the annual budget, including conference attendance at the Police Executive Research Forum - National Meeting; the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives [NOBLE] Mid-Year CEO Conference and the International Association of Chiefs of Police [IACP] Annual Conference.
- h. "Regular Office Hours" Hours will be 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M., Monday through Friday. Professional judgment and duty requirements will dictate "Actual Hours" required. The Director of Public Safety position is a management level position and is not eligible for overtime compensation.

The EJIF is applying to DCA for a Joint Services Incentive Grant to fund a feasibility study. The proposed program would establish a joint municipal facility to provide a uniform approach and individual support to the redevelopment of municipal properties with known contamination (commonly referred to as "brownfields"). To be successful we need resolutions from several member municipalities endorsing the grant application.

For your convenience a DCA reviewed draft resolution has been prepared. A copy is attached.

In order to meet the DCA application deadline we need a copy of your municipality's resolution at the office of the EJIF Executive Director by February 18. The enclosed information is intended to address your questions. Your should also feel free to call if you need clarification or other help.

The following material addresses:

- * an application for a "Joint Services Incentive Grant" from DCA to fund a proposed feasibility study for a municipal "brownfields" program
- * the required municipal resolutions supporting the application to DCA for the grant
- * the fact that there is no financial commitment imposed on the supporting municipalities

<u>Overview</u>

The New Jersey Municipal Environmental Risk Management Fund (the EJIF) provides protection from many environmental liability exposures related to municipal operations. Many member municipalities have expressed a need for a program to address liabilities related to properties with known contamination. These are now commonly referred to as "brownfields". The EJIF Board believes that a program for municipal brownfields would be of value to many of the fund's members and has proposed that a feasibility study be prepared to investigate alternative program structures.

As part of this effort the board of the New Jersey Municipal Environmental Risk Management Fund (the EJIF) is seeking the support of a representative group of its 200 member municipalities for the fund's application for a Joint Services Incentive Grant from the Department of Community Affairs. To be effective this support must be in the form of a resolution; for your convenience proposed wording has been reviewed by DCA and is attached.

This act of support entails no financial commitment from the individual municipalities for either the proposed study or any resulting program. Indeed, the proposed feasibility study is intended to examine ways to develop a voluntary program for EJIF members so that only those interested would contribute to its funding.

Background

The New Jersey Municipal Environmental Risk Management Fund provides coverage for a broad range of environmental liability exposures related to daily municipal operations. Several members have expressed a need for a program to help them deal with properties with known contamination or special projects with environmental exposures. Specific examples include:

- * abandoned gasoline stations and auto repair facilities with underground storage tanks and related contamination
- a small manufacturing plant with radioactive contamination
- comparable industrial and commercial sites with municipal held tax title liens
- * a deteriorated town center shopping strip with contamination from abandoned

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dry cleaning and gasoline station sites; being considered for condemnation for inclusion in a redevelopment project

- * an idle former DPW yard near the center of town; currently unsalable without at least some remediation
- * several pending municipal projects to remove and/or replace existing underground storage tanks in order to comply with environmental regulations
- * municipal owned closed landfills; of potential interest to developers because of size and location; additional remediation/containment is likely and liability protection afforded the new owner or user as part of marketing the property

While each situation has its own issues collectively these municipalities must address several challenges if they choose to redevelop these properties with known contamination:

- * exposure to mandated remedial action as owner
- * unknown projected costs to remediate
- * exposure to unbudgeted cost overruns during remediation
- * uncertain market value after remediation
- * limited expertise and access to funding for investigations, remediation, and remarketing
- * limited expertise and access to insurance to mitigate the financial exposures

Addressing the Challenges

In its capacity as Executive Director of the EJIF PERMA has talked to many of the relevant parties about developing a program to address these challenges. These include several EJIF member municipalities, the NJ Department of Community Affairs, the NJ Department of Environmental Protection, the US EPA, the NJ Office of State Planning, environmental insurers, developers, bankers, and environmental attorneys. These discussions have been very encouraging.

One thing is clear. There is no standard approach and only limited understanding of the challenges in redeveloping municipal properties with contamination. The fundamental objective of the proposed program is to establish a standard, comprehensive approach to

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managing the redevelopment of municipal brownfields and then to be able to provide support services those participants that seek them.

Subject to member approval the program potentially would be capable of providing on an "as needed/as desired" basis the following services:

* access to a broad range of insurance coverages, either through EJIF or a special purpose "brownfields" joint insurance fund

third party liability as owner costs of unanticipated mandated remediation remediation budget cost overruns liability protection to new owners and their lenders defense costs

- * support in obtaining funding for environmental investigations including Phase I and Phase II studies as well as remedial investigations. The source typically will be grants from the NJ Hazardous Discharge Site Remediation Fund;
- * support in the foreclosure process;
- * support in identifying alternative reuses and sources of funding for the level of remediation appropriate for the proposed reuse
- * support in remarketing the property
- * support generally in working with State and Federal regulatory authorities

Based on discussions with officials from more than 20 EJIF members it is clear that at any point in time many members will benefit from the availability of such a program and that over time the majority are likely to utilize its services.

Therefore, the Board of the EJIF has decided to tackle this problem by sponsoring the preparation of a feasibility study and implementation plan. The Board has set aside a portion of its 1996 surplus to help fund the study. But the Board is requiring additional, outside financial support. The DCA's Joint Service Incentive Grant is one of the most likely potential sources of these additional funds.
