




Dear Council Members:







- (7) Matters Relating to Litigation, Negotiations and the Attorney-Client Privilege: Any pending or anticipated litigation or contract negotiation in which the public body is, or may become a party. Any matters falling within the attorney-client privilege, to the extent that confidentiality is required in order for the attorney to exercise his ethical duties as a lawyer.
- (8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Council of the Township of Willingboro, assembled in public session on August 24 , 1993, that an Executive Session closed to the public shall be held on August 24; 1993 at 10:25 p.m. in the Willingboro Township Municipal Complex, One Salem Road Willingboro, New Jersey, for the discussion of matters relating to the specific items designated above.



Eligibility Criteria: At least age 50 with 25 or more years of pension membership credit

PERS & TPAF members* —→ additional 5 years of pension membership credit

*Eligible employees who retire on a veteran's retirement benefit will receive an incentive equal to 5/60 of final year's salary

CATEGORY II (Applies only if employer currently provides employer-paid health benefits to retirees)*

Eligibility Criteria: At least age 60 with 20 but less than 25 years of pension membership credit

OTHER SALIENT FEATURES

- PERS and TPAF members who meet the pension membership requirement of 25 years but are not age 55 are subject to the reduction factor for early retirement (1/4 of 1% for each month under 55).
- The additional five years of pension membership credit provides approximately a 16% increase in retirement benefits on average for PERS and TPAF members.
- The additional retirement incentive benefit is applicable only to full-time employment with the employer who elects to provide the benefits authorized under this incentive program and from which the employee retires to receive the benefit and the compensation for that employment.
- A PERS or TPAF member retiring under the provisions of the Early Retirement Incentive Program who has not repaid the full amount of a loan by the effective date of retirement will have the option of repaying the balance of the loan plus interest in monthly installments deducted from the retirement benefit. Employees will also have the option of paying off the loan in one lump sum or applying full pension checks toward the loan balance.
- Should a PERS or TPAF member, whose retirement date is postponed, die before the retirement becomes effective, the member's surviving beneficiary may elect to receive a retirement benefit rather than a lump sum death benefit and the return of the member's contributions to the retirement system.



After obtaining some additional information regarding the Early Retirement Program I have projected the cost and savings through the year 2000. The cost projections is based on a five year payment plan and will be paid in full by the year 2000. See schedule B.

The savings was computed by first projecting a five percent salary increase for each year through the year 2000. I then charted the eligible employees and replacement employees for each year. Schedule C and D show these projections.

Schedule A summarizes the cost and the savings for each year. Please note that the library is not included in these figures because they are outside of CAP. I am working on their projections separately. I have indicated the amount of accumulated sick and vacation pay based on 1994 projected rates.
