





- (8) Matters Relating to the Employment Relationship: Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance of promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all the individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting.



## Problem Statement

During March of 1985 the State of New Jersey passed a seat belt law as a secondary offense to a moving violation. Prior to enactment a statewide usage survey revealed that only 18.2 percent of the motoring public were wearing seat belts. Subsequent surveys revealed that the compliance rate rose to 42% and then on to 59% respectively.

Research clearly indicates that the use of seat belts and child safety seats has a significant effect in reducing the number of deaths and severity of injuries resulting from traffic crashes. Strong evidence also indicates that the level of public compliance with a law of the nature has a direct relationship to the number of persons who will survive a serious traffic crash.

Law enforcement agencies can have a significant effect in getting motorists to use seat belts, thus saving money and lives and reducing injuries in their communities. The results of years of research and demonstration are clear. The majority of motorists will form the seat belt habit, but only if there is a law, if the law is enforced and if motorists are aware of that enforcement.

In this regard it is apparent that in order to reach the national goal of 70% usage rate by the end of 92 increased enforcement efforts must be implemented.

## Project Description

This project will provide the funds necessary to implement a seat belt enforcement and educational program within the community. On an overtime basis police officers will conduct special enforcement patrols and issue primary summonses for all violations of Title 39 of the Motor Vehicle Code. A seat belt summons will be issued as a secondary offence to all front seat passengers who are not buckled up. Also required will be the strict enforcement of the motorcycle helmet and child safety restraint law. Additionally, funds will be provided to implement a seat belt educational program which will allow police officers to deliver seat belt presentations to Community groups and discuss the positive effects of proper seat belt use.

Three seat belt use surveys will be conducted on municipal time. One prior to implementation of the program, one during and one at the conclusion. These surveys will take place for at least one hour at controlled intersections.

A vigorous public information campaign will be implemented soliciting participation from local newspapers, radio and television stations. All business, civic groups and other organizations will be encouraged to lend support to the program. Localized public information materials and pamphlets will be developed and printed for distribution. All tangible materials will include a message that they were funded by the National

Highway Traffic Safety Administration; Division of Highway Traffic Safety.

### Objective

To increase the seat belt usage rate by 10% throughout the community utilizing enforcement, education and civic involvement.

### Performance Indicators

1. That the seat belt surveys reflect an increase in the usage rate.
2. That seat belt summonses issued are proportionate to moving violations.

### Milestones

Project will be implemented as indicated on page one (1) and monitored on a monthly basis to correct any deficiencies that might exist. Three occupant restraint use surveys will be conducted.

### Evaluation

The final evaluation shall include a description and assessment of all activities related to the project whether funded DHTS or by other sources.

### Reporting

The project direction will maintain accurate monthly records depicting seat belt survey results, moving, seat belt, motorcycle, child restraint summonses issued and other project involvement such as media events and presentations made to civic groups. This information will be forwarded to DHTS by the 10th of month following the operational month.

Attached please find some information regarding the Tullytown Landfill expansion project. Enclosures include:

- A Brief Narrative
- Geological Reports by NJDEPE's Robert Canace
- An Federal EPA Fact Sheet
- Excerpts from Pennsylvania's Coastal Zone Management Plan
- A report from Professional Systems Associates

In short the situation is this. Waste Management of America (WMI) in Pennsylvania already owns and operates two landfills on the Delaware River, GROWS and Tullytown. The GROWS landfill, which contains 3% toxic waste, is scheduled for closure. The Federal EPA is delaying that closure, pending studies regarding the leaking of the landfill. The Tullytown landfill is seeking to expand from 120 acres to 273 acres and this will not be the last expansion.

Both landfills are sited in low lying lands. The Tullytown landfill in particular is on a site which used to be wetlands and a wild game preserve. This is critical because these lands are 1)prone to flooding, and 2)PRM aquifer recharge sites.

Because of its poor siting, the landfilling operation stands to affect this entire New Jersey region. The landfill liner has a 20 year guarantee. No one disputes that the liner will eventually leak. When it does, the Tullytown landfill will leak into the Delaware River and the underlying aquifer from which every town in New Jersey within 15 miles of the river, from Bordentown to Salem, draws its drinking water. Water quality in the river is already becoming hazardous for some endangered species south of Florence. (We have some reports from Rutgers on this.)

Furthermore, Willingboro is within Critical Area 2 of the PRM Aquifer. This is an area with significant cones of depression and therefore protected by Executive Order of the Governor. Because of

these cones of depression, contamination leaking from these Pennsylvania landfills will be drawn toward New Jersey's public supply wells.


There are a number of other planning issues which currently affect Florence more than they will Willingboro; issues like the dangerous proximity of the landfill to our schools and the general degradation of our quality of life. But as this landfill grows, it will affect the entire region. Keep in mind that WMI owns or controls 4000 contiguous low lying acres in Pennsylvania, all of which will be landfill or landfill related operations. The cumulative impact of a facility of that size will destroy this part of New Jersey.

We are convinced that the reason WMI is siting these landfills in this area is because there are not many Pennsylvania residents in the area to object. In fact, there are more New Jersey residents living closer to the landfills than there are Pennsylvania residents. From New Jersey's perspective there are many environmental and planning reasons why this is a poor location for the landfills. The location of the state line allows WMI to escape the scrutiny of New Jersey. It provides WMI with a convenient "loophole" through which to ignore these issues. Most of the negative impacts are encumbered upon New Jersey which has no jurisdiction over the siting of the facility.

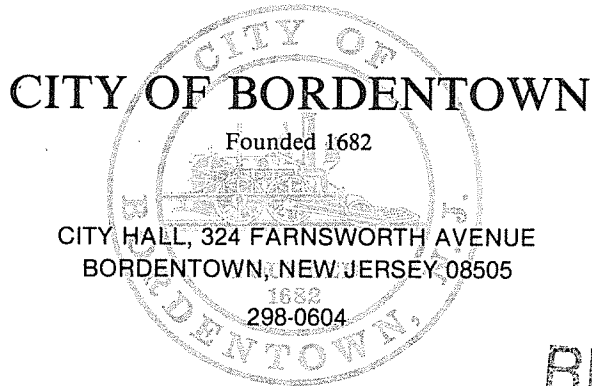
Mayor Sampson and I have already met with the New Jersey State Planning Commission to brief them on the situation. We went with the support, in the form of resolutions or letters, of several Townships in the area. Deputy Mayor Malone of Bordentown also joined us. I have another meeting with a subcommittee of the Commission on October 8th and then the Commission will convene a meeting of all parties at all levels of government; local, state regional and federal - Pennsylvanian and New Jerseyan. The Commission appears genuinely concerned about the cumulative impacts and the long range plans of WMI in the area.

We would certainly like to have the support of Willingboro Township. I'd be happy to meet with the Council to offer them more information. I hope the enclosed material is of assistance. Let me know if I can do more.

CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN  
FOR  
WILLINGBORO TOWNSHIP

This plan is established to comply with the requirements of NJSA 40A:5-14 and to provide a guide to municipal officials and employees in carrying out their duties concerning the receipt and disbursement of all funds of Willingboro Township.

The following requirements shall be adhered to:

- A. The Township Council shall annually, at its reorganization meeting, designate the legal depositories for all municipal funds. The resolution may be amended or supplemented from time to time as the Township Council deems necessary. Such resolution(s) shall be deemed a part of the Cash Management Plan.
- B. The Township Council shall annually establish by resolution, adopted at its annual reorganization meeting, the required signatories to all municipal bank accounts.
- C. All municipal funds received by any official or employee shall be either deposited within 48 hours to an interest-bearing account in the name of Willingboro Township, or shall be turned over to the Treasurer within 48 hours of receipt.
- D. All revenues received by the Treasurer shall be deposited to interest-bearing accounts in the legal depositories.
- E. The following funds shall not be required to be maintained in interest-bearing accounts:
  1. Change Funds
  2. Petty Cash Funds
  3. Payroll Funds
  4. Trust Funds, to the extent that the deposit of such funds to an interest-bearing account would require by law the payment of interest to the provider of funds.
  5. Checking accounts established for the express purpose of paying bills approved by the governing body. The balances in these funds shall be kept at the minimum amount required for the orderly operation of the account.
  6. Compensating balances maintained for the purpose of obtaining specific services from financial institutions. Such accounts shall be established only under terms of written agreements approved by the Township Council

CASH MANAGEMENT PLAN (CONTINUED)

- F. The Tax Collector shall promptly remit any funds collected during the month to the Treasurer.
- G. No municipal funds shall be disbursed by the Treasurer prior to approval of the Township Council except for:
  - 1. Debt Service Payments
  - 2. Investments
  - 3. Payroll turnovers to agencies
  - 4. Discount vouchers

Debt service payments and discount vouchers must be ratified after payment.

It shall be the responsibility of the Treasurer to analyze the cash flow and to invest funds in legal investments so as to maximize interest earnings. When investing funds in commercial banks, savings banks, savings and loan associations, etc., the Treasurer shall obtain a minimum of three quotations and shall invest at the institution offering the highest effective rate. The Treasurer shall determine which type of legal investment will best serve the needs of the municipality and is authorized to place the funds in any such legal investment, unless otherwise restricted by the governing body.

The Treasurer shall report monthly all investment transactions, as required by NJS 40A:5-15.2, to the Township Council.


