BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF WILLINGBORO, IN THE COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$1,871,800 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,778,210 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WILLINGBORO, IN THE COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds call members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Willingboro, in the County of Burlington, New Jersey (the "Township") as general improvements. For the several improvement or purposes described in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of mone therein stated as the appropriation made for each improvement or purpose, such sums amounting in the aggregate to \$1,871,800, and further including the aggregate sum of \$93,590 as the several down payments for the improvements or purposes required by the Local Bond Law. The dow payments have been made available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the several improvements or purposes no covered by application of the several down payments, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,778,210 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The several improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for which the bonds are to be issued, the estimated cost of each improvement and the appropriation therefor, the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each improvement and the period of usefulness of each improvement are as follows:

Kennedy Center, replacement of the hollow metal doors and frames for the pool houses and restrooms at the Willingboro Recreation Center, renovation of the restroom at the John F. Kennedy Center, parking lot pole lighting upgrades at the Municipal Complex and the John Kennedy Center, various improvements to the Municipal Complex (as more fully described on a list on file in the Office of the Clerk, which list is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth at length), tennis court upgrades lighting improvements to the turf field at Fairmont Park and improvements to various municipal buildings (as more fully described on a list on file in the Office of the Clerk. which list is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth at length), including all related costs expenditures and incidental thereto and further including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto.

(iii) Acquisition and installation of an ADA-compliant stair lift at the John F. Kennedy Center and improvements to the heating, ventilation and air conditioning system, including all related costs and expenditures incidental \$720,300 \$684,285 10 years

thereto and further including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto. h) <u>Streets</u> : Construction of speed bumps and other traffic calming devices for various streets (as more fully described on a list on file in the Office of the Clerk, which list is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth at length), including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto.	\$60,000 \$30,000	\$57,000 \$28,500	15 years

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the down payment for each purpose.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times a may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note sha mature later than one year from its date, unless such bond anticipation notes are permitted to mature at such later date in accordance with applicable law. The bond anticipation notes shall be a interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond

anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law or other applicable law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to separt or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to delive them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report i writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation note sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The Township hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Township i hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of an inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has bee filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited an stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are no current expenses. They are all improvements or purposes that the Township may lawfull undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be speciall assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.

- (b) The average period of usefulness, computed on the basis of the respective amount of obligations authorized for each purpose and the reasonable life thereof within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 9.91 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been dul prepared and filed in the office of the Acting Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$1,778,210, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$200,000 for items of expense listed in an permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purposes or improvements.

Section 7. The Township hereby declares the intent of the Township to issue bonds of bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes or improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of the Treasury Regulations.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purposes or improvements described i Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligation authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the Township is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Township and to execute such disclosure documer on behalf of the Township. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Township pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the beneft of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Township and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counse consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Township fails to comply with it undertaking, the Township shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof afte final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

If an employee assumes an "Acting" title, they shall receive a stipend equal to the amount necessary for them to be compensated at the minimum salary of the corresponding range if their current salary is below that minimum salary. If an employee assumes an "Acting" title and their current salary is above the minimum, they shall receive up to a \$5,000 stipend if the stipend does not increase their salary above the maximum. Stipends are payable in addition to the base salary, based on a 26-week payroll cycle, and are not to be used in the calculation of any contractual, cost of living increases an employee may receive. Stipends are not to be rolled into base salary and will be discontinued immediately, once the employee is no longer serving in that "Acting" role. At no time may any employee fill more than one "Acting" role simultaneously.

3dc Deferred Compensation Contribution

The Township shall match the deferred compensation contribution of eligible executive employees at a rate not to exceed \$1,300 per year for Range II, III, IV, and V and \$2,620 per year for Range VI.

3ed Health Insurance will be provided upon retirement, for eligible executive employees after completing 20 years of full-time service with Willingboro Township. Willingboro Township will pay the cost of health carepremiums in the amount of 50% of the cost of coverage for the Single Plan or 50% of the cost of coverage for the Husband-and-Wife Plan, for whichever plan the employee was enrolled in during the three-year preceding their retirement date. If the employee enrolls in a private healthcare insurance plan other than the plan in which the Township is currently participating, the Township will only pay the equivalent amount of the premium that would have been incurred if the employee were to remain in the plan in which the Township is currently participating. If the employee retires before the age of 65, Willingboro Township will pay the cost of health care premiums until the retired employee reaches eligibility for Medicare Part A. Eligibility is governed by N.J. Chapter 48, P.L 1999.

3f e All other benefits for full-time executive employees will follow the LESA Contract.

3g-f Uniform Allowance

The uniform allowance for the Fire and Deputy Fire/EMT Chief will match the Superior Fire Officer's Contract.

3h g Salary Increase: Two percent 2% increase on July 1, 2015. On July 1 thereafter salaries will increase annually for not less than 100% of the cost-of-living adjustment for the Philadelphia-South Jersey areas determined by statistics provided by the US Department of Labor for all consumers CPU-I, not to exceed a two percent (2%) salary increase.

ORDINANCE CHANGING THE NAME OF LEVITT PARKWAY CR 629 TO VETERAN'S PARKWAY CR 629 IN WILLINGBORO TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the Willingboro Township desires to change the name of Levitt Parkway to Veteran's Parkway; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40:67-1(k) provides that the governing body of a municipality may make, amend, repeal and enforce ordinances to provide for changing the names of streets within such municipality; and

WHEREAS this name change shall affect the length of Levitt Parkway CR 629 from the eastern Municipal boundary with Westampton Township at the connection to Woodlane Road and continuing west towards the U.S. Route 130 intersection; and

WHEREAS Burlington County supports these efforts and will work with Willingboro Township and the State to physically change the name of Levitt Parkway to Veteran's Parkway and ensure the proper process is followed.



- Section 1. The name of Levitt Parkway CR 629 shall become "Veteran's Parkway CR 629."
- Section 2. The name change of Levitt Parkway shall affect the portion of the length of Levitt Parkway beginning at the easterly connection to Woodlane Road in Westampton, running in a westerly direction along Levitt Parkway CR 629, to the westerly boundary intersecting at U.S. Route 130.
- Section 3. The Willingboro Post Office shall be notified of such change by providing a copy of this Ordinance.
- Section 4. All residences and businesses with frontage on Levitt Parkway shall be notified of such change by certified mail and regular mail.
- Section 5. The Willingboro Police Department and Willingboro Fire/E.M.S. Department and Burlington County 911 shall be notified of such change by providing a copy of this Ordinance.
- Section 6. All bordering Municipalities shall be notified of such change by providing a copy of this Ordinance.
- Section 7. Burlington County Board of Commissioners and the Burlington County Engineering Department/County Engineer, and the State of New Jersey shall be notified so appropriate signage changes may be made.

Section 7. Appropriate signage shall be installed to reflect the street name change.

Section 8. According to law, this Ordinance shall become effective on November 1, 2022, four months after adoption and publication.
