POLICE, FIRE, & EMS

The Public Safety Department is under the supervision of the acting director and they are responsible for overseeing the following: the Willingboro Police Department, the Fire Department, the Emergency Squad, the O.E.M, School Crossing Guards and Township Security Guards.

Purpose Statement:

The Willingboro Township Police Department is committed to working collectively alongside our community partners to ensure they enjoy the highest quality of life. Employing the community policing model, the department hosts and attends community events; continuously seeking to enhance our relationships with residents and local business owners alike.

The Willingboro Fire Department is a combination of full-time firefighters, volunteer firefighters, and volunteer fire police officers. In addition to the full-time administration personnel, there are full-time fire supervisors and full-time firefighters who are assigned to one of three fire platoons that work a 24-hour shift.

The department responds to over 1,700 incidents per year. They respond to incidents such as house and building fires, vehicle fires, fire and carbon monoxide alarm activations, downed wires, and traffic accidents.

Willingboro Emergency Medical Services is staffed by full-time and per-diem Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs). These dedicated personnel operate at least one ambulance 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The department also staffs a power-shift ambulance Monday-Friday from 9:30 am to 5:30 pm.

The department responds to approximately 4,900 calls for service a year. The type of incidents it responds to include medical, diabetic, and cardiac emergencies, along with strokes and fall victims. The department also responds in unison with the Township's fire department to motor vehicle and pedestrian-motor vehicle accidents, along with structure and vehicle fires and carbon monoxide alarm activations.

FINANCE

The Finance Department oversees the maintenance of Township funds, under the direction of the Chief Financial Officer. The CFO is responsible for the overall supervision of tax collection, purchasing, payroll and accounts payable, receivable and general accounting offices.

Tax payments are under the direction of the Tax Collector. Payments are due quarterly on the first of each of the following months – February, May, August, and November. A late fee will be assessed for all payments received after the 10th of the month. * All added assessment letters will be processed within ten (10) business days of all required documentation.

PROPERTY TAX DEDUCTIONS (Must meet all requirements)

Veterans & Widows of Veterans

- Had active wartime service in the United States Armed Forces and been honorably discharged
- · Own the property, wholly or in part, or hold legal title to the property for which deduction is claimed
- Document that the deceased veteran or service person was a citizen and resident of New Jersey at death who had active wartime service in the United States Armed Forces and who was honorably discharged or who died on active wartime duly
- Not remarried
- · Be a legal or domiciliary resident of New Jersey

Senior Citizens

- Proof of age 65 years or older
- Annual income cannot exceed \$10,000 excluding Social Security

Disabled Veterans

- · Had active wartime service in United States Armed Forces and been honorably discharged
- Have a United States Veterans Administration certification of service-connected disability issued in accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.30, ET. SEQ.
- · Wholly own or hold legal title to the dwelling house for which exemption is claimed
- · Occupy the dwelling house as the principal residence
- · Be a citizen and legal or domiciliary resident of New Jersey

Surviving Spouse of a Disabled Veteran or Service Person Claimant

- Document that the deceased veteran or service person was a citizen and resident of New Jersey at death who had active wartime service in the United States Armed Forces and who was honorably discharged or who died on active wartime duty
- Document that the deceased veteran had a United States Veterans Administration Certification of service connected disability issued in accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:4.3.30, ET. SEQ.
- Not remarried

INSPECTIONS

The Inspections Department is a critical component in maintaining the livability of the community. This department has many facets, as well as, overseeing every aspect of residential/commercial matters that consist of several things, including: new construction, permits, additions, rental/resale, maintenance liens, code enforcement, property maintenance, rehabilitation, water heaters and community master plan.

The UCC sub-code officials are responsible for electrical, plumbing, mechanical, fire and building inspections.

PERMITS ARE REQUIRED FOR THE FOLLOWING:

- Construction/Rehabilitation
- Site Plan Review
- Electrical
- Conversions
- Demolition

Code Enforcement Officers/Housing Inspectors

The Code Enforcement and the Housing Inspector work hand-in-hand. Primarily, the Housing Inspector is responsible for inspecting the inside of the dwelling. The goal of code enforcement is to ensure that all properties in Willingboro are maintained in a safe and sanitary manner.

Code Enforcement Officers are responsible for the oversight of every aspect of residential and commercial property maintenance and general township code compliance.

The list below details many areas that fall under the jurisdiction of the code enforcement officer and the housing inspector:

- Property maintenance enforcement
- · Zoning and sign permits

- Inspections for resale property
- Inspections for vacant and abandoned property

- Pool permits zoning review
- Health and sanitation inspections
- Inspections for rental property

Property Inspections

Code Enforcement Officers, Housing Inspectors and UCC Officials inspect residential and commercial properties for critical maintenance issues, such as, landscaping issues, trash, hazardous debris and unsanitary conditions. The department also conducts housing inspections for resale and rentals of single family dwellings.

Code Enforcement Process

Code enforcement cases can begin in a number of different ways; most commonly, a complaint is called into the department by a citizen. Complaints may remain anonymous or they may leave a name and number so they can be contacted in the future.

The Department of Public Works (DPW) serves our community with pride and commitment. Every day of every season and in all kinds of weather the DPW works hard to improve our residents' quality of life. The department's responsibilities include but is not limited to overseeing trash collections, bulky waste pick-up, snow removal, leaf collection, brush pick-up, recycling collection, and street sweeping.

Brush & Tree Limbs

- Bundle or tie brush and tree limbs for bulk collection up to five bundles can be collected by appointment. *The bundles should not be more than 3 ft and 30 lbs.*
- Residents can also place smaller bundles for pick-up in regular trash.

Leaf Collection (Fall Only)

- Collection occurs approximately between the last week of October and the second week of January.
- All leaves should be placed curbside.
- DO NOT PUT LEAVES IN THE TRASH FOR COLLECTION.
- Be sure leaves are free of sticks, limbs, branches, and grass.
- Do not place leaves on the sidewalk, road, or storm drains.
- Residents are responsible for removal after the scheduled pick up occurs.

Snow Removal Alert

The Township will begin plowing snow and/or salting roads as dictated by the storms and weather conditions. It is important to remove vehicles off the street to allow for an efficient snow removal operation once 2" of snow has been predicted. Residents/occupants are required to remove snow/ice from sidewalks within 24 hours after the termination of the snowfall.
